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### The saga of the SPAUG laptop:

1. The SPAUG laptop was set up and running but quit and locked up during the panel discussion necessitating switching to the backup laptop.
2. The SPAUG laptop did not respond to resetting, so it was abandoned on the spot.
3. When the laptop was turned on several days later, it responded normally. No explanation is apparent.
4. The SPAUG laptop was then loaded with *Dragon Naturally Speaking*, which seemed to go rather well, but when tested, the speakers were found to be dead.

The driver in place was current, but a note from the sound card manufacturer stated that the sound hardware would not work under Windows 7.

I was in favor of replacement of the computer, but John Buck suggested that we use a sandbox to install the older Vista wherein the sound card would be active for zero dollars spent. I'll mention how that experiment worked next newsletter.

### No-Reformat, Nondestructive

#### Total-Rebuild

As viruses get more and more sophisticated and destructive, they abandon the pretense and effort to coexist peacefully and invoke self-protective measures to block corrective software, block access to corrective internal routines, and generally destroy the operating system. In these cases, you need to have someone use the procedure below to resurrect a computer that has had critical part(s) of the operating system destroyed.

This procedure is not totally benign, but will get an XP or Vista or Win7 computer going again without losing customer data! This is sometimes called: No-Reformat, Nondestructive Total-Rebuild Option

The procedure you should use to rebuild an operating system is:

1. Back up your entire computer, if necessary, using a boot-time backup program such as Acronis offers. This assures that your data can be retrieved in case of catastrophic collapse and allows research for key data from a second drive. (If you need it, buy Acronis True Image Home via Gene Barlow's ugr.com.)
2. Use **Magic Jelly Bean Finder** to search for and report to you what your installed key is. Not necessary if you have your key somewhere including it being on the case of the computer or in your archive materials from the manufacturer. I tend to use it anyhow to assure that the key can be found on the desktop. Sometimes what is in the computer is not the key reported by the manufacturer.
3. The sequence of starting the REPAIR option is well documented in the Langa Letter. The startup of the operating system repair process is the initial booting of the Microsoft CD via its utterly misleading initial messages.
4. Once you have finished the initial file replacement run, you will have replaced the entire operating system with good files from the CD. Then install the Service Pack(s), and finally the current patches – a process that can easily take several hours. Using a CD that has been slip-streamed to SP3 is a timesaver, as only the patches will have to be brought current – often a multi-pass procedure.

At the end you should have a fully-functioning computer from your backup, with all data intact. If not, bring the data over from your backup; but I have never had to do this.

## **My Near-Death Experience With A Virus** by Larry Templeton

### **Onset Of The Problem**

The first symptom was a failure to boot normally. Trying to reboot didn't help. Acronis wouldn't run. Safe mode worked so I used that to copy off my most recent files. I found later that this didn't do a complete job, probably because file info had been destroyed by the virus. I also found that my most recent backups were damaged. All this led me to suspect a major hard drive failure.

### **Attempts To Solve The Problem**

Safe mode seemed reliable so I tried running chkdsk, but that wouldn't run to completion. I also tried running a virus scan from safe mode, but the virus scan wouldn't run. Then I tried running system restore, but without success. All previous restore points were gone. Fixmbr ran normally but didn't fix the problem. In fact, the problem seemed to be getting worse. Files began disappearing from Windows Explorer. I was getting desperate.

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### Capitulation

Eventually even safe mode wouldn't boot up. Without this I was blind. I tried to install the drive on another computer so I could look at the directory, but the other machine wouldn't even recognize the drive. By this time I knew I was in big trouble. Fortunately I had a backup computer that I could use until restoration was completed.

### Outside Diagnosis And Recommendations

I took the drive to Hank Skawinski who, after a half hour of testing, said, "This thing is toast. You need to take it to a professional data recovery company". I was reluctant to do this because they're expensive (\$1,000+).

### The Road To Recovery

I went to the net to find a drive recovery program and located Prosoft Engineering < <http://www.prosofteng.com/> >, a company in Livermore, that advertised DataRescue PC, a program that sounded perfect. So, I downloaded it (\$100). It didn't work. It recognized the hard drive and began scanning, but the scanning stopped about 10% of the way in. I tried this several times but it stopped at the same point every time. I called their customer service. They were very nice but had no practical solutions. So I gave up on them.

Back to the internet. This time I found **EASEUS**, a Chinese company, that advertised **Data Recovery Wizard®** < <http://www.easeus.com/datarecoverywizard/> >, which sounded like a good solution. I downloaded it (\$70). Lo and behold, the EASUS software ran perfectly and recovered about 80% of the info on the drive. This is really good software. The interface is clean and easy to use.

### The Long Road Back

The first task was formatting the drive and reinstalling Win 7. Next came installing new antivirus software. I gave the old heave-ho to Avast and installed Comodo's internet security suite.

On the first scan, Comodo found 12 instances of 2 trojans on my backup drive and in the recovered files. So much for Avast. Then began the tedious job of reinstalling my old programs and data files. The programs probably took half a day. I had most of the program license codes and was able to recover the others from manufacturers' web sites. Most of the data files were easy, but some took a bit of research. Recovering my emails and addresses from Thunderbird was a particular challenge. Now that I know how to do it, it's easy, but it took some learning.

### The End Result

Everything is back and running fine. In one place or another, I eventually found all of my data files (including my as-of-then not filed Turbotax stuff. Whew!!)

### The Moral

- Do conscientious, regular backups.
- Occasionally (maybe once every week or so) create a complete image of your C: drive on a completely separate drive, preferably an external drive.
- Always have a recent image away from your computer.
- Meticulously maintain records of your software purchases, licenses and other related info.
- Get the best antivirus software you can get. I'm currently running:
  - Comodo Internet Suite,

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- IOBit's Malware Fighter Pro < <http://www.iobit.com/malware-fighter-pro.html> > (was Malwarebytes), and
- Super Anti Spyware.

They each have a different focus and I'm trying to cover the waterfront.

- In a belt-and-suspenders move, I also subscribed to Carbonite online backup.

### Filler by John Buck

**OCR Online**—A Sunday bulletin from my church had as page of text that I wanted as an editable file. The free OCR downloads I have on my pc are not very accurate. Thinking about the various “translation” apps I’ve used online, I wondered if an OCR “translator” might be available. Google™-searching—<http://tinyurl.com/3f3wv69>—had many hits. The one I tried—<http://www.onlineocr.net/>—scanned the page perfectly. The Output, in MS Word, looked like the printed input.

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### Capture Entire (Scrolling) Windows in Firefox—

Just as Brits and Yanks have evolved different terms for the same thing, there seems to be a Microsoft vocabulary and as non-MS one. For example—

- What MS calls a **context menu**, others call the **right-click menu**.
- What MS calls a **scrolling page** or window, others call the **entire window**.

Opera is my primary browser. Palemoon (a FF clone) is second. I have limited my use of IE primarily for—

- Connecting to Microsoft
- Capturing scrolling (browser) windows, via—
  - **Faststone Capture**  
<http://tinyurl.com/28dppy>
  - **Pickpic**—<http://tinyurl.com/nku28k>—because neither of them worked with Opera or Palemoon.

These two programs will also capture scrolling non-browser windows. Faststone Capture can capture wide windows, in addition to tall ones.

Via Snapfiles.com, I learned of a **Firefox** add-on that would capture entire (that is, scrolling) windows. That program got many scathing reviews, so is not listed here. Palemoon’s add-on manager listed at least four programs that seemed to do what I wanted, so I tried them and settled on **Screengrab**, because I liked its interface much more than the other three (Screenshot Pimp, Shooter, and Abduction!).

I’ve not yet found a scrolling-window capture program for Opera
