After receiving another invitation from another member, and having received invitations at other times from many other people I trust, I took the bait and set up a LinkedIn account. Well, not entirely (I hope). When LI asked for my email password, I balked, stopped, and investigated. Dody and I exchanged many emails and phone calls about this, and agreed it's something we don't want to pursue further.

September 11, 2013 General Meeting Notes

ADMINISTRATIVE

- We need a treasurer. Nat can no longer continue the post. Volunteers contact John Buck.
- Brad Youngman and Maury Green have volunteered to stand as presidential candidates in our November SPAUG election.

CROSSTALK

- Robert Mitchell toured the headquarters of Sutable Technologies, makers of the Beam Remote Presence System that was presented at our August 14, 2013 meeting. Robert was impressed by what he saw.
- Photoshop—pay monthly, or switch?
 - Maury Green says there is a special \$9.99 deal. Maury says he will stick with the older version.
 - Brad Youngman suggests Light Zone is available for free with registration (<http://lightzoneproject.org/>).
 - Pixlr (<http://pixlr.com>) is another possibility.

- Gimp has a Photoshop-like interface.
- There are many free programs available, but capabilities vary. Google-search for [free cs3].
- Email addresses in the SPAUG newsletter have “ AT ” instead of “ @ ” and “ DOT ” instead of “ . ” to prevent robot scraping. Even PDFs can be scraped.

Rachel from Box says they have a solution.

There are many strategies, but whether they work or not is questionable.

Maury Green says two-part authentication is a good preventive measure; works on Google and others.

- Brad Youngman said **DO NOT CLICK ON A POP-UP FBI WARNING**. He reported that a Sunnyvale Senior Center (SC) member had done so, resulting in many problems that were difficult and time-consuming to correct. AVG’s free online scanner finally seemed to remove the virus, but only after trying many other virus cleaners. At that point, the Win7 OS partially worked, and Brad and others were able to download and use "Windows Easy Transfer" to capture data from the original installation. They then used Windows Easy Transfer to return data to the computer after reinstalling the OS. However, application programs had to be reinstalled. **THINK before you click! Don't even try to simply close the pop-up window; shut the computer down.**

To make recovery from malware easier, **MAKE AN IMAGE BACKUP** periodically!

- Jim Dinkey recommends the Sunnyvale Senior Center for computer problems. The Win8 expert at the Sunnyvale Senior Center is Jim Hurley.
- Keyloggers are a problem; but you may be able to fool them by alternating back and forth between typing one or more needed characters in the required field, then typing some random letters in another part of the screen, away from the password entry field, then some more of the required characters in the field. The program needing the password will use only the characters in its entry field; the keylogger won't know which characters are in the field and which are not.
- SPAUG has bought and is using two new HP laptop computers.
- Silicon Valley Computer Society (SVCS, www.svcs.net) has four meetings per month, 7 PM on Mondays. Programs are at Central Computers' Santa Clara location. Their photo and slide scanner is fixed, and hopefully Central Computers will provide a secure location so it can be again made available to members of SVCS.
- Jim Dinkey asks what do we want to buy for break refreshments? Seven people said coffee would be nice; many others felt no need for it. Maury will send a poll to the membership asking preference.

PRESENTATION BY BOX CUSTOMER SUCCESS TEAM "SPAUG and the Cloud"

- Free 25 GB storage is available for SPAUG members today.

- The Box Customer Success Team acts as a **Strategic Partner**, provides **Set-up Support**, serves as a customer **Ally**, and helps customers **Get the Most** from Box.
- **History** of Box:
 - Originally Box.net, founded in 2005. Founded as a USC business school project.
 - Goal: to easily access info from anywhere.
 - Located in Los Altos on El Camino Real. Now has offices in San Francisco and London. 180,000 businesses, including 97% of the Fortune 500. Box has over 950 employees.
- **The Cloud**" is everywhere: email, iCloud, banking, Google Drive, Facebook, Picasa, etc are all "in the cloud". Box should enable accessing all your things in the cloud from anywhere. An example is sharing photos. The "hard copy" version is the old way. You can upload everything to Box, just drag and drop a folder. Share with only those you want to. Control of access and permissions is at the Folder level. Demo of photo of SPAUG group quickly uploaded and viewed.
- **Documents can be shared** among many users. Comments can be added to explain changes. The file can be temporarily locked to prevent "stepping on toes". Box can handle most file types.

Box provides user "roles" with different permissions: view, comment, edit, delete, etc. Box provides heavy encryption for files transferred over the Internet.

- **Filing capability.** Instead of, or in addition to, storing hard copies with Box, you upload whatever needs to be kept.

- Organize various types of document in folders. A search box allows quick finding by filename, date range, owner, content of file, keywords.
- There is an ecosystem of applications that work with Box, e.g., TurboTax, MS Office, etc.
- When an email with attachments is sent to a Box folder, the attachments are automatically added to the folder.
- Use a phone camera to scan a document and upload it.
- Box security is extensive and many-tiered.
- **A trip planning example.**
 - Create a folder for travel documents.
 - Create a subfolder for each category of document. Most file types are supported. Blogs, websites, spreadsheets, documents, maps, etc. can be easily added.

More, from ghacks—“You can't create two files or folders with the same name and file extension in Windows in the same directory. If you need to rename a folder or file in a folder to a name that is already re-

served by another file or folder, you are in for a lengthy name changing operation. You first rename the original file or folder, before you can rename the new file or folder so that it is now named like the original file. If you have to run the command quite often, you may be inclined to write a small batch file to automate it to speed it up.

Swap'em is a portable program for Windows that handles the file or folder name swapping for you. You can either use the interface for that, or integrate the functionality in Windows Explorer.
