But I have found an inexpensive way to sort and store diskettes with a 5×8 file card box. With index tabs these run about \$4.00 and easily store 30 or more diskettes.

An inexpensive way to store printout is with stackable trays, typically less than \$4.00. They fit right on top of your monitor.

PERIODICAL REVIEW

Virtually all the PC-related magazines have articles this month concerning the new DOS 2.00. These include Softalk for the IBM PC (first year's subscription is free when you mail them your serial number), PC, PC World, and PC Age.

There is a DOS patch that enables the "Scroll Lock" key in the May issue of Softalk. It works and I have given it to Mike for the club library. Look for Scrollk.com and doc.

A review of four word processors/text editors for the IBM is in the <u>May issue of Byte</u>. Also in the Maty issue is another program allowing the Epson MX-80 to use more features in conjunction with Wordstar; an article on how to write better software manuals; and more than you probably ever wanted to know about the IBM keyboard.

The 80186, 8087, as well as the NS16000 and MC68000 are discussed in the April issue of Byte.

Unix spin-off Qunix name has been changed to QNX and is now only available as The Quantum System. Good article on the features of this DOS 2.00 lookalike in Vol. 1, No. 12 PC.
