Bits and Bytes -

Here's an important warning to all DOS 2.0 users. Last month I mentioned problems with a hard disk on a pew IBM PC XT. Although my problem was hardware related, I also found out about an error in the DOS 2.0 FORMAT routine. If you have DOS 2.0 with a date prior to 10/83, the FORMAT routine will not correctly mask out bad sectors.

This is a serious error that has received very little publicity. IBM knows about the error and will correct it through your dealer. I don't know if this problem affects MS-DOS 2.0 on compatibles.

When you format either a hard disk or a floppy you get a message that tells you the number of bytes on the disk, the number of bytes in hidden files and user files (if you formatted with the /S option), and the number of bytes in bad sectors, if any. You usually don't get any bad sectors, but if you do, it means that part of the disk can't be used reliably to read and write data. These parts are marked as bad sectors and are not used when you write a file to the disk.

The older version of DOS 2.0 does not correctly mark bad sectors. The result is that files are written to these bad areas on the disk. You then get data errors when you try to read the file. In effect, you have lost the file.

Even if you recently bought DOS 2.0, check the date. Do a DIR on your DOS disk and see what date is displayed. I got my XT in February and the date of DOS was 3/8/83. IBM has a correction to the FORMAT command on what they call a ZAP disk. You can get it free from the dealer that sold you your PC.

More DOS 2.0 problems from Chuck Harrington in the Athens Area IBM PC Users Group Newsletter:

There is a very serious bug in the BACKUP and RESTORE pair of programs provided with DOS 2.0 for use with the IBM fixed disk. If you use the BACKUP program and then use the RESTORE program, you may find that a file will be incompletely restored to the fixed disk. The file exists on the backup diskette but the RESTORE program is unable to get all of it restored to the fixed disk. Apparently, the links between the file sectors on the floppy diskette are somehow damaged. What's worse, no error message warns you of the problem so you won't discover it until you attempt to use the file in question. The problem apparently occurs at random and there is no known way to predict which file will be clobbered.

IBM in Boca Raton has acknowledged that they have a problem and are working on Until the problem is fixed, the BACKUP and RESTORE pair can not be counted on. It is necessary to backup your files manually to diskette. This can be somewhat laborious, but it's the only safe way.

This isn't a bug in DOS 2.0 but a warning if you use it. Be careful if you convert from the PC to the XT or just trade up from DOS 1.1 to DOS 2.0. When you copy files from your old DOS 1.1 disks to the hard disk (or floppies formatted with DOS 2.0), make sure you don't copy any DOS 1.1 files or utilities. If you use COPY A:*.* C: and the disk in A: is a system disk, you won't copy the hidden files but you will copy COMMAND.COM and any utilities such as CHKDSK.COM or FORMAT.COM. This can cause all kinds of unexpected results because of incompatiblities between the two operating systems.

To be safe, do a DIR on any DOS 1.1 disk before you copy it to a DOS 2.0 disk. Then only copy the files that won't clobber your DOS 2.0 files.
