JUNE MEETING

Patty Campbell from Software Publishing in Mountain View demonstrated Harvard Total Project Manager (HTPM) at the June meeting. She not only explained the specific features of this software package, but also explained project management in general.

Project management software enables managers to understand the impact of their decisions on the rest of the project, to forecast, and to base decisions on a position of knowledge rather than a gut feeling. HTPM addresses all four phases of project management: planning, scheduling, controlling and reporting.

Patty also mentioned that the Statue of Liberty renovation project was managed with HTPM. She distributed demo disks, a copy of which was placed in the club library.

NEWS AND NOTES

Comparative Reviews of Databases, Portables, and Graphics Boards.

The last two months' of PC Magazine have reviewed most of the major products in these categories and compared them in charts and analysis. The editors have indicated their favorites but users will have different preferences depending upon needs.

The Video 7 Vega Board, being presented at this month's meeting is among those reviewed. However there are some products advertised in the magazine that are not reviewed--e.g., the Orchid Turbo EGA plus and the Paradise Autoswitch EGA. In the reviews of laptops, the Toshiba T-1100 plus is not included although the T-1100 is reviewed.

The issue of 3.5" diskettes has become a hot one with the Laptop computers. These smaller and easier to use diskettes store more information but can't be used in a standard PC. One must either buy a new disk drive and DOS 3.2 or transfer data by modem. The other problem here is that many copy-protected programs don't come on 3.5" diskettes.

New Programs from Jim Button

We have five new programs from Jim Button, dated February 1986. These are the latest release of PC-FILE III, a typing program called PC-TYPE, a communications program called PC-DIAL, a program to help you write better business letters—called PC-STYLE, and a new program called PC-TICKLE which is an appointment calendar which can also balance your check book or keep track of expenses or calories for you. He did not include PC-GRAPH in the package.

These are user-supported programs which you may try out before you buy. The price is low to register and the benefits are numerous--including technical support and access to a bulletin

board. Buttonware prohibits distribution of outdated programs, so the library will discard all old versions and keep only the current ones; you should do likewise. These latest versions will be available at the meeting.

ABCdesign's CHARLIE graphics package, new release as of May 1986 is now available in the library.

Excelsior Software's new BASICREF 1.04 is now available in the library.

A STOCK TRADER program, ver. 2.0, 1986, which is distributed under its own version of Freeware, called "FreeBooter" will be available at the meeting and in the library.

THOT4DAY/REV a new program in the library that brings us some cute sayings each time you boot up instead of the old A or C prompt.

ALAN'S DISK #1 AND #2. These two disks, available at the meeting, provide BANNERIFIC, a program that creates banners in different sizes and type styles a maze game called CAVE, an editor called ALAN'S EDITOR, and a spreadsheet, called ALAN'S CALC. The BANNERIFIC program is provided free, paid for by advertising. The others are user supported.

NEW DEMO DISKS: Vanilla Software's DISKETTE COOKBOOK, and New England Software's GRAPH-IN-THE-BOX. Check them out from the library.

LOTUS TIP

Lotus 1-2-3 version 1A and version 2 have different functions for entering the current date, which can create a problem in date calculations and comparisons. The problem isn't one of conversion because Release 2 translates the functions automatically. The problem lies in the different ways the date is stored.

Release 2's @NOW function expresses the current date in terms of the date and time (a fraction), while 1A's @TODAY function consists of the date only (a whole number). If you ever compare to see if a date is equal to @TODAY, it will always be false with @NOW because of the fraction. This can be fixed by comparing a date to @INT(@NOW).

SECRET DISK

If you are worried about people getting into your computer files, you might want to get Secret Disk to encrypt individual files or your whole system.

John Dvorak recommended this \$119 program in his On Computers column in the San Francisco Examiner (July 20). John pointed out that data security is going to be a common problem in the business community when local area networks allow users to access each others' files.

FLICKER FREEE

A memory resident program called Flickerfree will eliminate screen flicker and increase screen scrolling speed by 300-1500 percent on most systems. This \$39 program works with the IBM Monochrome Display Adapter, Hercules card, and Color Graphics Adapter, and most compatibles.



STRIKE OUT THOSE TYPOS

An inexpensive memory-resident spelling checker, called Strike, will check your words as you type. When you type a word it doesn't recognize, Strike will beep at you and display a list of suggested correct spellings. Strike lists for only \$29.95 and is published by S&K Technology (4610 Spotted Oak Woods, San Antonio, TX 78249).

Strike, however, is slower than its competitors (Reference Set and Turbo Lightning), has a smaller dictionary, and is occasionally erratic in the incorrect words it detects. But sometimes you get what you pay for, right?

DISK ACCELERATORS

Hard disk users with many data file: stored in sub-directories can get significant performance improvement by putting a CONFIG.SYS file in the root directory (or if booting from a floppy, on the boot diskette). The file should contain the line BUFFERS=22. To create this file, type the following at the DOS prompt:

COPY CON: CONFIG. SYS BUFFERS=22

Press Ctrl-Z to save the file.

However, by allocating that much memory to buffers, there may not be enough space left over to run certain utilities like FORMAT.COM. The simple solution for that circumstance is to boot from a floppy that does not have a CONFIG.SYS file on it. Another solution is to temporarily rename the CONFIG.SYS file you may have in the root director of your hard disk and reboot.

There is also a new product out called Super PC-Kwik Disk Accelerator which increases performance of disk drives by taking advantage of extra memory. Substantial time is saved when using applications that make frequent disk accesses.

Generally programs run 2-1/2 times faster on a hard disk and 7 times faster on floppy disks.

Users should have enough memory for their applications, plus at least 32K of additional memory. The program lists for \$79.95 and is published by Multisoft Corp., 18220 S.W. Monte Verdi Blvd. Beaverton, OR 97007; (503) 642-7108.

FLOPPY COPIES ON A HARD DISK

With a two-floppy drive system, it's very easy to copy floppy disks with the DISKCOPY program. Though you can still use DISKCOPY to copy disks if you have only one floppy drive, it requires quite a few disk swaps. An alternative is to copy the files onto the hard disk, remove the floppy, insert the backup floppy into the drive, and copy the files from the hard disk. Then you have to delete the files that were left on the hard disk.

A batch file can eliminate most of the tedium from this procedure.

Fist, set aside an area of the hard disk for file copying by creating a directory called BIN. In the root directory at the DOS prompt, type MD BIN.

Type the following to create BIN.BAT:

C: COPY CON BIN.BAT ECHO OFF ECHO This batch file will copy all files from a disk in ECHO Drive A: to C:\BIN, copy the files to a backup disk in ECHO Drive A:, then delete the files in C:\BIN ECHO Insert source disk in Drive A. PAUSE CLS ECHO Copying ... COPY A: *. * C:\BIN ECHO Insert backup disk in Drive A. PAUSE CLS ECHO Copying ... COPY C:\BIN*.* A: ECHO ON DEL C:\BIN*.*

Press Ctrl-Z and RETURN to save the file. Type BIN when you wish to copy a floppy disk.

FANCY FORMATS by Dana B. Snow

This month I would like to demonstrate the use of several batch commands to create a useful front-end to the MS/PC DOS FORMAT program. These batch files will allow the continuous formatting (with file copy and diskette labels) of diskettes on drives a: and b:. Change the --- statements to rem or omit You may remove the rem statments once the batch files are tested and working to speed execution. Note the use of redirection for both the creation of the format.kbd file and to use it as input to FORMAT.COM in leu of The output of FORMAT and the keyboard. COPY are redirected to the NUL device so that thier normal output is not displayed.

FMAT.BAT is identical to FMATCPY.BAT except for the removal of the four marked (**) statements and the last line. Each batch file is recursive, it calls itself until terminated by Ctrl-Break

When using Echo there MUST be at least two spaces after "Echo" (and before > redirection) to output a blank line. DOS 3.1 needs an Alt-255 character instead of the second space so you will have to use an editor that supports the entire IBM character set such as EDLIN.

In the IF == statements note the use of the period on each side of the == . This stops DOS from issuing an error message if a test is being performed and there was no parameter entered.
